ὑπομονή hypomoné, hoop-om-on-ay' – steadfastness, constancy, patiently, and steadfastly, a patient, steadfast waiting for, a patient enduring, sustaining, perseverance, endurance. In the NT the characteristic of a man who is not swerved from his deliberate purpose and his loyalty to faith and piety by even the greatest trials and sufferings.

Heb. 10:36-39 You need to persevere so that when you have done the will of God, you will receive what he has promised. For, "In just a little while, he who is coming will come and will not delay." And, "But my righteous one will live by faith. And I take no pleasure in the one who shrinks back." But we do not belong to those who shrink back and are destroyed, but to those who have faith and are saved.
