The Importance of the Resurrection 1 Cor. 15:12-20

"It is a serious thing to live in a society of possible gods and goddesses, to remember that the dullest and most uninteresting person you talk to may one day be a creature which, if you saw it now, you would strongly be tempted to worship, or else a horror and a corruption such as you now meet, if at all only in a nightmare. All day long we are, in some degree, helping each other to one or the other of these destinations. It is in the light of these overwhelming possibilities, it is with the awe and circumspection proper to them, that we should conduct all our dealings with one another, all friendships, all loves, all play, all politics. There are no ordinary people. You have never talked to a mere mortal." (Stedman quoting C.S. Lewis)

When Christ redeemed us, he did not just redeem our spirits and souls, he redeemed us as a whole person, meaning that he redeemed our bodies also. He redeemed a believer's body, soul and spirit for glorification so that we could dwell with him as a whole person for eternity; that's eternal life. This is the hope we possess because of our faith in Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior.

II. Without the veracity of the resurrection, our lives would be no better off than that of an animal confined to its basic instincts without any understanding of life after death. In Fact, without the resurrection, the truth of Scriptures would be nullified and without effect, and our faith would be a joke and no different than what non-believers put their faith in.
