The Importance of the Resurrection 1 Cor. 15:12-20

"It is a serious thing to live in a society of possible gods and goddesses, to remember that the dullest and most uninteresting person you talk to may one day be a creature which, if you saw it now, you would strongly be tempted to worship, or else a horror and a corruption such as you now meet, if at all only in a nightmare. All day long we are, in some degree, helping each other to one or the other of these destinations. It is in the light of these overwhelming possibilities, it is with the awe and circumspection proper to them, that we should conduct all our dealings with one another, all friendships, all loves, all play, all politics. There are no ordinary people. You have never talked to a mere mortal." (Stedman quoting C.S. Lewis)

When Christ redeemed us, he did not just redeem our spirits and souls, he redeemed us as a whole person meaning that he redeemed our bodies also. He redeemed a believer's body, soul and spirit for glorification so that we could dwell with him as a whole resurrected person for eternity; that's eternal life. This is the hope we possess because of our faith in Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior.

The body that is sown is perishable, it is raised imperishable; 43 it is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory; it is sown in weakness, it is raised in power; 44 it is sown a natural body, it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual body.

After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the LORD in the air. And so we will be with the LORD forever.

Without the truth of the resurrection, we would have no hope beyond the grave. In Fact, without the resurrection the Scriptures would be without inerrant truth and meaningless. Our faith would be a joke and no different than what non-believers put their faith in. Like the unredeemed, we would still be dead in our sins and surely lost.
