John's response at the end of Revelation should characterize Christians' hearts inn all ages: "Amen. Come, Lord Jesus!" (Rev. 22:20). It also gives some measure of the degree to which we see the world as it really is, as God sees it, in bondage to sin and rebellion against God, and in the power of the evil one (1 John 5:19). - Grudem
