Revelation 21:1-8

I. God has given us a very detailed description in the book of Revelation of the extent He will go to exterminate sin and those who embrace it from ever influencing His creation again. For Satan and the demons, it will mean being permanently cast into the lake of fire to suffer for ever and ever. For the unbeliever, it will mean the same fate. For the believer, it will mean living an eternity in a new heaven and new earth totally free from sin and its influence. *The plain sense of the Word* teaches us that our reality, as believers, will change. We will be given resurrected bodies and an eternal dwelling with God Himself in a perfect sin free holy environment that will never ever change. That is why we are commanded to, *Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. 3 For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. 4 When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory (Col. 3:2-4).*

Kainos (new) as respects form – recently made, fresh, recent, unused, unworn. As respects substance – of a new kind, unprecedented, novel, uncommon, unheard of. Strong's Concordance **II.** John makes a distinction between the New Jerusalem and the newly created heaven and earth. The New Jerusalem already exists. It is an actual eternal city prepared by God for His redeemed people. MacArthur states, "All of heaven is currently contained in the New Jerusalem; it is separate from the present universe, which is tainted by sin. Believers who die go to the 'heavenly Jerusalem," where Jesus has gone before them to prepare a place for them (John 14:1-3)."

"If the NEW JERUSALEM already exists, and if this is the place Jesus is preparing for you, then when you are Raptured, whether you are asleep in Christ or remain on the earth at that time, then the instant you are caught up to be with Christ, this is likely where you are going. According to 1 Corinthians 15:52 this happens as fast as the 'twinkling of an eye.' In other words, 'Here today, in NEW JERUSALEM tomorrow,' alluding to the unknown tomorrow when the rapture occurs."
